

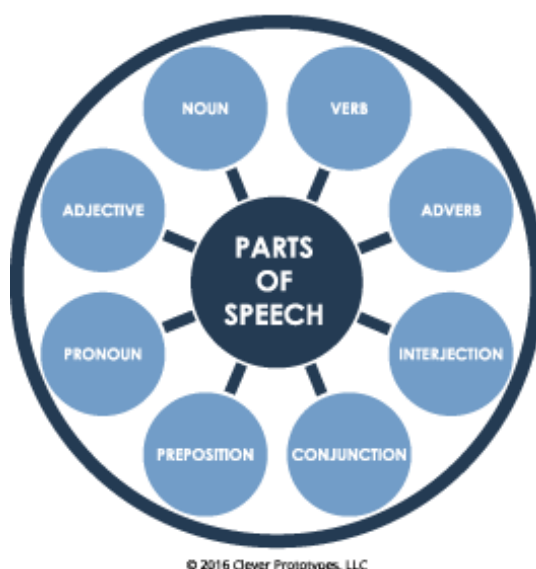
# Parts of Speech

## What are the Parts of Speech? Parts of Speech Definition and Examples

Part of Speech	Definition	Example Words
<b>NOUN</b>	a person, place, thing, or idea	pen, dog, work, music, town, London, teacher, John
<b>VERB</b>	action or state of being	(to) be, have, do, like, work, sing, can, must
<b>ADJECTIVE</b>	a quality of a noun	some, good, big, red, interesting

ADVERB	describes a verb, adjective, or another adverb	quickly, silently, well, badly, very, really
PRONOUN	stands in for a noun	I, you, he, she, we, they, your
PREPOSITION	links a noun to another word	to, at, after, on, before, around, over, of, in, for, with, throughout, from, beneath
CONJUNCTION	joins words, clauses, and sentences	and, but, when, or, however, although, nevertheless, therefore, yet, so
INTERJECTION	short exclamation, sometimes inserted into a sentence	oh, ouch, hi, well

## Do You Know Each Part of Speech?

<i>Ouch!</i> That hurts!	<i>Hi!</i> How are you?	<i>Well</i> , I don't know.
I like dogs <i>and</i> I like cats.	I like cats <i>or</i> dogs.	I like dogs, <i>but</i> I don't like cats.
Tara is smart. <i>She</i> is going to college three years early.	George wants <i>his</i> paper back.	Rashad wants a book, so <i>he</i> goes to the library.
Facebook.com <i>is</i> a website.	I <i>like</i> Facebook.com.	I <i>check</i> my Facebook every day.
This is my <i>dog</i> .	He lives in my <i>house</i> .	We live in <i>London</i> .
We went <i>to</i> school <i>on</i> Monday.	Please look <i>under</i> the bed	The book is <i>about</i> a boy who gets lost <i>in</i> the woods.
My dog is <i>big</i> .	I like <i>big</i> dogs.	My <i>big</i> German Shepherd is <i>better</i> than your <i>tiny</i> Chihuahua.
